## Launch of Emmanuel Mission House

For young people at university the **Emmanuel Mission House** provides an opportunity for intellectual, pastoral and spiritual formation whilst completing their studies. For graduates this formation extends into a year of full-time service for the church in the university and beyond. The House is a project of the **Tertiary Chaplaincy of the Archdiocese of Sydney** in collaboration with the Emmanuel Community.


The house is located in Bridge Road, Glebe in the heart of Sydney's premier university district. Cardinal Pell invites young people to take part in the life of the house: "Pope John Paul so often reminds us that the young people of today are the future leaders of society and the church. How especially true this is of university students!

"Yet even during their time at university, at the modern Aereopagus of ideas and culture, they have numerous opportunities to witness to Christ and the truth of the gospel in the face of many challenges such as secularism, indifference and isolation. In order to remain faithful to this call they need to pray, to be grounded in the Church's Tradition, to be sustained as a part of the Catholic community and to give themselves in service, all the while remaining diligent in their studies and maintaining a basic social life. The particular challenge they face in the university is to demonstrate that faith and reason are not irreconcilable, but that 'Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth'.

"The need is there to form the youth leaders of the church to find new ways of communicating the hope that comes from Jesus Christ, the unique Saviour of the world.

"The existence of Emmanuel Mission House provides for students and graduates a unique opportunity to benefit from a leadership formation with a strong spiritual and community experience, which it is hoped will assist us in this vital task of building and strengthening the Church on campus."

## New Term begins in Catholic Adult Education Centre

The **Catholic Adult Education Centre** in Lidcombe begins its second year of teaching this month, with five subjects on offer.

On Tuesday mornings Fr John Flader will give "Jesus Christ". And on Thursday evenings Peter Holmes will give "Scripture and the End Times" and Fr Anthony Robbie "Controversies in Church History."

All subjects are given at the Centre in Lidcombe.

Those unable to attend the classes in Lidcombe due to distance or medical reasons may do the courses by correspondence.

Students may select any individual units they desire, or they may enrol in a Certificate in Faith Education, usually done over two years, or a Certificate in Youth Ministry. The Certificate in Faith Education is accredited by the Catholic Education Office for the teaching of Religious Education in Catholic Schools and by the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine for catechists.

## Australasian Catholic Directory 1841-1899

The Official year book of the Catholic Church in Australasia called the **Australasian Catholic Directory** was first issued in 1841. The Sydney Archdiocesan Archives is now making available copies of 29 volumes of this publication on CD as a valuable resource for research and reference.

The Australasian Catholic Directory is unique in Australian Church history because it records the growth of the Church in the southern hemisphere. With lists and information concerning the clergy, dioceses, parishes, church buildings, religious institutions, guilds, associations, schools and religious congregations for each year it is a comprehensive and authoritative source of information regarding the Catholic Church for the period including also New Zealand and Oceania.

There are also pastoral letters of Archbishop Polding and biographical information on early Church figures and personalities, with portraits and pictures of early clerics and buildings. The Directory of Divine Service is incorporated containing invaluable information about the liturgy and devotions to the saints and prayers and practices of the Church of the time.

This edition on CD is searchable. The page images were scanned and converted into text within an Adobe Reader file, to create a searchable, scrollable image.
